Jesus in Deuteronomy

- Jesus is the better prophet like Moses who reveals God's salvation (18.15, 34.10; cf. Jn 1.18, 14.9)
- Jesus' perfect obedience secures the blessings (28.1-14), and his death bears the curses (28.15-68)
- Christ's cross is the tree of curse (21.23) that "redeems us from the curse of the law" (Gal 3.13)
- Christ does not abolish the law, but fulfills it (Mt 5.17, John 4:34, Romans 7:4-6, 2 Corinthians 3:4-18)
- The new covenant brings the promised regeneration (30.6; cf. Jer 31.31-33, Ezk 36.26-27, Heb 10.11-18)
- When Jesus is tempted by Satan in Luke 4:1-13, he quotes exclusively from Deuteronomy 6-8: Where Adam & Israel failed, succumbing to Satan's temptation, Christ succeeds!
- Moses dies in the wilderness. Joshua leads into the promised land. Jesus is the Greek / Aramaic translation of "Joshua". Jesus dies in the wilderness (outside the camp, under the law) and rises again to lead us into the promised land. He is the greater Moses & the greater Joshua!
