Chronicles is one book which was divided into two scrolls and is now thought of as two books. It is one story that reaches all the way back to Adam and from Adam to the exile. It is a book written to give hope to the exiles. Kings focusses

on the failure of Israel and God's just judgment. Chronicles focusses on the hope that still belongs to Israel even after God's just judgment, the exile. On the whole, 1-2 Chronicles are more hopeful then 1-2 Samuel and 1-2 Kings. In fact, the book ends with an incomplete sentence, a cliff hanger, directing the reader to the future hope to come.

### Differences from 1-2 Samuel & 1-2 Kings


Focusses almost exclusively on Judah (the Southern Kingdom). Notes that many faithful northerners fled to Judah in the south (2 Chronicles 11:13-17). No mention of David and Bathsheba. No record of Solomon's foreign wives & idolatry. Instead of focusing on prophets & Kings, Chronicles focusses on priests and kings. It's a priestly history instead of a prophetic history.

#### <u>Setting</u>

Post Exile - the return of Israel to Israel after their brutal exile

## <u>Theme</u>

HOPE: The Covenant with David...the king is still coming (Genesis 3:15, 49:10, Deuteronomy 17:14-20, 1 Chronicles 17:11-14)
